



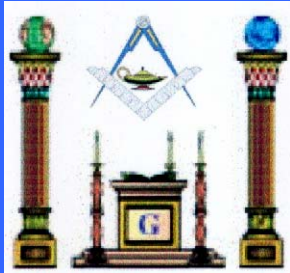

ADDGM Steven Legette Receives Military Award

Assistant District Deputy Steven "Shah" Legette of the 29th Masonic District was recently awarded the 2007-2008 Navy Plans, Operations, Medical and Intelligence Officer of the Year.

His specific achievements while deployed as the Health Care Operations Officer in support of Global war on Terrorism-Afghanistan are:

- Demonstrated strong diplomatic skills, he fostered a trusting relationship between the ANP Office of the Surgeon General and the Ministry of Public Health that resulted in unprecedented sharing of medical resources.
- He planned and managed 61 medical facility projects totaling over \$334M for infrastructure, equipment and sustainment.
- Having no background in health care facility planning, he researched and designed 10 Community healthcare Clinics valued over \$11.7M and the first ever Medical Depot valued at \$1.4M.
- He developed a distribution plan for 297 ambulances valued over \$43.5M for the ANP health care system, ultimately modernizing casualty evacuation capabilities for ANP.
- He was instrumental in the success of the Trauma Assistance Program School opening and development of the training plan for 509 medics, which will greatly decrease the died-of-wounds rate on the battlefield.

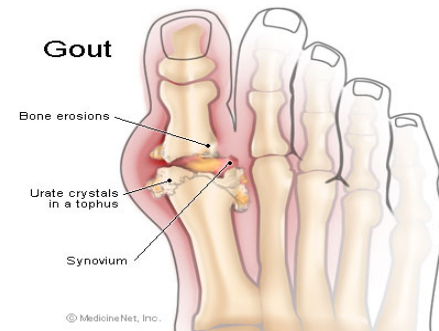

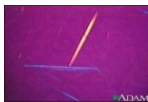

Gouty Arthritis



Gouty arthritis or “the gout” as referred by many people, is one of the profound disabling arthritides. Gout is a painful type of arthritis that involves the buildup of uric acid crystals in and around the joint; this may involve the toe, ankle, knee, elbow, fingers, etc. Over a number of years, the deposits of uric acid at the joint site may disfigure the joint. The deposit of uric acid is called tophi. Gout during the time of Hippocrates who is also known as the “father of medicine” was referred to as the “disease of kings” due to the association of rich food and the consumption of alcohol. Uric acid is produced by a biochemical reaction in the body. The production of uric acid depends on the foods that are high in purines ingested by an individual. The foods that are high in purines such as asparagus, herring, gravy, liver, mackerel, sardines, scallops, dried beans and peas, beef kidney, mushrooms, and game meats should be avoided. The uric acid may also be produced by the rapid turnover of cells in the body and ingestion of certain medications such as diuretics or “fluid pills”, aspirin, and those related to cancer treatment.

Gout occurs more often in men than women. The age group varies from 40-50 and older, but young children do not develop gout. The diagnosis of gout involves the microscopic examination of fluid taken from the joint. One looks for the collection of uric acid crystals.



The doctor may also obtain blood and determine the uric acid level in the body. A high uric acid level does not make the diagnosis of gout. The high uric acid level may signal the acute flare up of gout. For those who have suffered with attacks of gout, you will quickly comment on the intensity of the pain. Most people say the discomfort is so severe that you cannot allow a sheet or blanket to touch the foot or joint that is involved.

The treatment of gout consists of a combination of therapies. The goal is to prevent future attacks, the formation of tophi, and reduce the pain associated with the attack. Initially your doctor may give you a medicine referred as a nonsteroidal anti-inflammatory drug (NSAID) such as Motrin, Naprosyn, or Indocin. After the acute flare-up has resolved, you may be started on another medicine called allopurinol. This medication will prevent the excess production of uric acid in the body. Another drug named probenecid is used to remove excess uric acid from the body in the urine. Of course, foods high in purines should also be avoided.

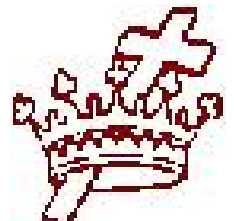

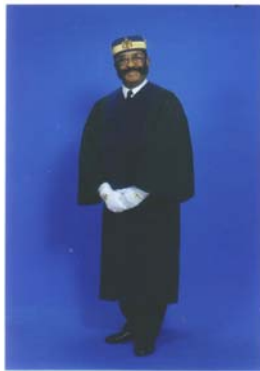

MESSAGE FROM THE BEEHIVE EDITOR




Greetings Prince Hall Family,
